

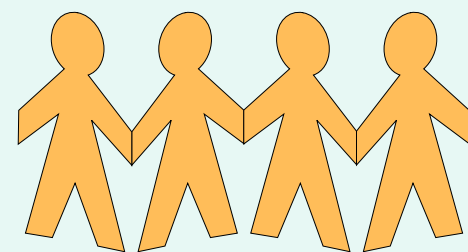
THE MOBILITY
