It was really interesting and especially very rewarding to listen to all those different points of view, to learn more about other cultures, and to share all our ideas.

After each question, students thought by pairs about what they wanted to say, and it was a merry mess of English, French, Italian, Spanish, Croatian and Romanian, and sometimes even teachers answered the questions. But when we started to record there was a big silence and we were

all listening to the one who was speaking. We were all from a different country, but what was always coming back was a desire to change things, to improve society.



As Alessio, from Italy said: "We must be the difference. We must be the example for the future. We must raise new generations to avoid discriminations".




Finally, we had a great time during those three hours.

## **We watched a movie about overfishing, *The end of the line***

Charles Clover is a journalist investigating about overfishing, and the disappearance of life in the oceans. He meets a lot of different persons, who all have some difficulties linked to the sea: for example, an African man from Senegal who struggles with his fisherman job, a warden of Corsica's seashores who has to keep fishing boats and tourists from coming in the restricted area and Canadian few fishermen who are left in St John after the extinction of cods and the loss of 40000 person's job.

As the investigation goes, Charles Clover discovers more and more scandals, illegal activities and manipulations from some countries and companies, who are slowly destroying the whole ocean ecosystem. In Japan, for example, a firm who owns trawlers and freezers is fishing bluefin tuna although it's forbidden, in order to keep them and sell them later when there's no more.

Fortunately, there are also some countries and persons who are trying to save oceans inhabitants, and humans at the same time. In this way, in Alaska, fishermen have to wait for a certain time of the day to start fishing and have to stop at a particular time too. There also are more and more reserves where an abundance of life is possible.
